These beaches are easily accessible. Hikkaduwa is the first beach in Sri Lanka developed and maintained for tourism purpose. On this beach, you can enjoy fishing. The reefs run parallel to the seashore. The reefs can be easily investigated by snorkel and flippers. Sri Lanka is known for rich spices. Here, you will have spicier and delicious food. Traveling by train adds a unique experience to your tour to Sri Lanka. The network of rail lines has covered a part of the hill country. The rail lines are running along the mountains. The speed of trains is even slower than buses, so you can have a close view of nature beauty in hill area.

There are some sports like Canoeing and Kayaking, White water rafting, Hiking and Trekking, Mountain Biking, Safari and Elephant Safari. If you are spunky enough, you can be a part of rock climbing and diving. Camping is very popular among the Sri Lankans. You can get a camp set on some picturesque beach and enjoy several beach sports. Apart from these there are sports like Wind Surfing, Paragliding, Banana Boating, Ballooning, and National Cycle Trail is there to rejuvenate your senses.
