


Zimbabwe Travel Guide



Victoria Falls, Zimbabwe

Zimbabwe is full of scenic beauty and here only you would find the spectacular [Victoria Falls](#), splendid wildlife preserves as well as medieval remains of Great Zimbabwe along with the vibrant city of Harare. **Zimbabwe travel guide** offers description of this landlocked country nestled in south-central Africa between the Zambezi River in the North and the Limpopo River to the south.

The topography of Zimbabwe is mostly rolling upland and there is high plateau area known as Veld. The region of high plateau ultimately ends to Udizi and Inyanga mountains and here there is Mt. Inyangani which is the highest peak. Then you have the middle Veld ranging from 610m to 1,220 m height and Low Veld, which comprises of low-lying stretch of sandy plains in the basins of the Zambezi and the Limpopo. Zimbabwe travel guide offers more details of the relief and the presence of great rivers which are used for navigation. Zimbabwe comprises of following regions like Manicaland, Mashonaland, Masvingo, Matabeleland and Midlands. Victoria Falls is a cherished tourist destination here in Zimbabwe located in the western edge of the country. You can also visit Great Zimbabwe where there is the archeological relics of an ancient city of South Africa ancient city which was constructed entirely of stone. In fact the word 'Zimbabwe' literally means 'house of stone.' For spending days amidst scenic beauty of the nature the Eastern Highlands is an ideal choice where you will find mist covered mountains. Then you can also visit Lake Kariba or go and see the intricate rock formations at Matobo . Visa Info

Zimbabwe Travel Guide provides important details on Zimbabwe visa information. The following nationals do not require a visa for visiting the country: Aruba, Bahamas, Barbados, Belize, Bermuda, Botswana, Canada, Cayman Islands, Cyprus, Fiji, Grenada, Guyana, Ireland, Jamaica, Kenya, Kiribati, Leeward Islands, Lesotho, Malawi, Malaysia, Maldives, Malta, Mauritius, Montserrat, Namibia, Nauru, Samoa Western, Singapore, Solomon Islands, St. Kitts, St. Lucia, St. Vincent and the Grenadines, Swaziland, Sweden, Tanzania, Tonga, Trinidad and Tobago, Turks, Tuvalu, Uganda, Vanuatu, Zambia.

The nationals of the following countries could also be issued a visa on arrival to the country provided they pay the fees for it: Argentina, Australia, Austria, Belgium, Brazil, Brunei, Cook Islands, Denmark, Dominica Republic, Egypt, Finland, France, Germany, Ghana, Greece, Iceland, Indonesia, Israel, Italy, Japan, Korea (South), Kuwait, Luxembourg, Monaco, Netherlands, New Zealand, Palau Islands, Palestine (State of), Papua New Guinea, Poland, Portugal, Puerto Rico (USA), Seychelles, South Africa, Spain, Switzerland, USA, United Arab Emirates (UAE), United Kingdom, Vatican, Virgin Islands (USA).The nationals of the other countries would require a prior visa before visiting the country of Zimbabwe. Another important visa information is that the cost of the visa would depend on the type you require. The visa usually remains valid for a period of 6 months. The different types of visa which the Government of Zimbabwe issues include single entry visas, double entry visas and multiple entry visas. It would take

two days, at the very least, before your application for visa gets processed.

Another Zimbabwe visa information is that you would be required to submit the following documents at the time of applying for your visa:

- Correctly filled visa application
- 2 photograph (passport sized)
- Passport (Valid for a period of 6 months beyond the date on which you intend to return)
- Proof of funds (to meet expenses in the country)
- Return ticket
- Visa Fee
- Self stamped envelope (in case of postal applications) For further Zimbabwe visa information or for passport details get in touch with the Zimbabwe embassy nearest to you.

Getting In

Getting to Zimbabwe, is quite easy as compared to other South African countries. This landlocked country of South Africa, is surrounded by Botswana to the southwest, Zambia to the northwest, and Mozambique to the east and north. The country has considerably a good connectivity with almost all the major destinations of the world. The various way to reach this country is by air and land. Owing to a good number of trips undertaken by the tourists, this country has developed its network of transportation in the recent past.

The most feasible way of Getting to Zimbabwe is by boarding on to some of the world class flights to Zimbabwe. The country boasts of having four international airports scattered in various cities. The capital city of Harare has the main international airport, where flights like, Air Botswana, Air Malawi, Air Namibia, Air Zimbabwe (Beijing, Blantyre, Bulawayo, Dar es Salaam London-Gatwick, Victoria Falls.), British Airways, Ethiopian Airlines (Addis Ababa) Kenya Airways (Nairobi), Linhas Aéreas de Moçambique (Maputo), South African Airways (Johannesburg), TAAG Angola Airlines (Luanda), Zambian Airways (Lusaka), maintains a regular connection with this country. The trains offer an adventurous ride for Getting to Zimbabwe. The train from Bulawayo to the Victoria Falls offers a unique experience of traveling to Zimbabwe.

The other important way of Getting to Zimbabwe, is by availing a car. Owing to good number of smooth roads and highways, the country is easily accessible by car from the neighboring countries. The N1 highway from South Africa will take you from Cape Town via Bloemfontein and Johannesburg/Pretoria right to Harare. Apart from that the nationals of Botswana, Mozambique and Zambia can also get into this country through roadways. To enjoy a wonderful journey across the national parks, then you must board on to the regular deluxe bus services which operates from Johannesburg to Harare. There are frequent bus services from Johannesburg to Bulawayo.

Transport

Zimbabwe Travel Guide informs you about the various options of transportation in Zimbabwe. The different modes of transportation in Zimbabwe are listed below:

Planes

Transportation in Zimbabwe by air is facilitated by the national airlines of the country, Air Zimbabwe. Air Zimbabwe operates international as well as domestic flights in the country. The locations in Zimbabwe where the national airline of the country flies to are Bulawayo, Harare and Victoria Falls. The other domestic airlines of Zimbabwe include Air Zambezi, Airlink Zimbabwe, Avient Aviation, Mid Airlines and Zimbabwe Airlink. Some of the airports in Zimbabwe are listed below.

Train

A popular mode of transportation in Zimbabwe is by train. Extensive rail connections exist between the cities of Harare, Bulawayo, Victoria Falls and Mutare in Zimbabwe. The train journeys do not cost much and night journeys are quite frequent.

Bus

Another popular form of transportation in Zimbabwe is by bus. As far as the buses are concerned, express and local are the two types of buses which ply in the country. Most of the locals of the country travel by the local buses, which are quite cheaper than the express buses. On the other hand, the express buses are known to run on time and hence are more dependable. But if you want to mix with the locals of the country and are quite comfortable with the idea of traveling in crowded buses, then local buses would be the right choice.

Car

The roads in Zimbabwe are good enough for the tourists to have a good driving experience in the country. The highways in the country stretch to a length of more than 18, 000 kilometers. In the national parks and the wildlife reserves, maneuvering a four-wheeler would be an enjoyable task. Remember to take your driving license with you while going to Zimbabwe. Also keep in mind the fact that the left hand side of the road is made use of by the drivers on Zimbabwean roads.

Staying Here

Hotels

The payment for your stay in the hotel has to be made by foreign currency or by using your credit card. The hotels would not accept local currency, even if you can provide proof of having obtained the local currency through the proper channels. Higher the stars, higher would be the services and facilities provided by the hotels in the country.

Games Reserves and National Parks

Some of the game reserves provide luxurious accommodation in Zimbabwe. Cottages, lodges, etc. are offered by the national parks located in the country. These cottages and lodges come with all necessary facilities and services which ensure the comfort of the tourists. But here again you would be required to make your payments by foreign currency rather than the local Zimbabwean currency. United States Dollars are what is preferred throughout the country.

Leisure

As Zimbabwe is gradually making its presence felt as a paradise for the holiday goers therefore there are numerous options for entertainment and leisure in Zimbabwe. Be it celebrating a festival, hitting the innumerable nightlife destinations, shopping or simply opting for the plethora of adventurous sports, Zimbabwe never disappoints anyone when it comes to choice of entertainment and leisure in Zimbabwe. One of the most popular choices of entertainment and leisure in Zimbabwe is to hang out in the night clubs, bars, pubs and casinos where one gets to catch a glimpse exuberance and cheerfulness of the people of Zimbabwe. The most happening night out destinations of Zimbabwe are mostly confined to the cities and the major cities of Zimbabwe accommodates nightclubs, cinemas and repertory theaters.

One of the traditional options of entertainment and leisure in Zimbabwe is to enjoy safari tours and the tourists can hire boats for day or the entire week at Lake Kariba and its banks are full of wild animals like elephant, buffalo, rhinos as well as other animals. Victoria Falls, the world famous tourist destination offers the world's highest bungee jumps and the travelers can also enjoy excellent opportunities of whitewater rafting in the Zambezi Gorge and the best time for white water rafting is during the months of July and August as the river remains at its wildest best in these tow months. If you have any fascination for canoeing and kayaking then you can practice it on the more subdued river stretches above the numerous turbulent waterfalls falls. Zimbabwe also allows the travelers to enjoy hiking and trekking in the verdant countryside at the eastern highlands of Zimbabwe.

Zimbabwe is also renowned for offering excellent freshwater fishing and the most amazing locations for fishing in this country include being Lake Kariba the Zambezi River above the Victoria Falls, the streams of the Eastern Highlands and the innumerable lakes of Zimbabwe but if any when is willing to opt for trout fishing then he or she will require to get a permit. Other spectator's sports like cricket, golf and football are of immense popularity in Zimbabwe and cricket and football are the national sports of this country.

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
